HEAVY TRASH PICK UP

Heavy Trash Pickup occurs on the **first Tuesday** of each month. On "odd" months (January, March, May, etc.), all heavy trash, including tree trash, will be picked up. On "even" months (February, April, June, etc.) *only* tree trash will be picked up. Non-tree trash will not be picked up on "even" month days, as per city regulation. Tires, TVs, and paint cans will not be picked up and must be disposed of through different means (to rid of up to four tires, call 311). The earliest heavy trash can be placed on curbside for both "even" and "odd" months is 6:00 p.m. the prior Friday. Any sooner could call for a city inspector to issue a \$200-\$250 citation. The City of Houston also has a FREE dump ground about two miles from us at 10785 Southwest Freeway. Bring your water bill and a driver's license to dump up to five loads a month at any time.

DEED RESTRICTIONS

Restrictions including those pertaining to mowing, trash can visibility, the removal of tree stumps, parking in yards and garage sales (limited to two per year) can be found on the website.
